

2023 Prom Eligibility Requirements and Procedures

Eligibility to be nominated for Prom King and Queen

- 1) No Co-Curricular code violations, In or out of school suspensions, truancy notices or citations during students' junior year; Nor engagement in any activity during high school career that would deem student ineligible to be Prom King or Queen as decided by the Junior Class Advisors, Dean of Students, or Principals.
- 2) 2.0 GPA or higher following 3rd quarter grades.
- 3) The High School Principal reserves the right to deem a student ineligible.

*It is highly encouraged, but not required to be involved with the Prom Committee as well as the Pie Sale during Labor Day Weekend.

Prom Procedures

- The Grand March event will consist of Juniors on Prom Court, Prince and Princess, and the announcement of Prom King and Queen.
- The Junior class will vote to select/narrow the list of interested students to be on Prom Court. No more than eight (8) females and eight (8) males will be on Prom Court.
- The WAHS Student Body will vote for Prom King and Prom Queen.
- The Prom Committee will vote to select the Prom Prince and Princess.
- The Prom Committee will have meetings with the Prom Advisor(s) to plan the details of Prom preparations (e.g. Colors, Theme, Flowers, Decorations, Advertising and song list approved by Prom Advisor)
- The Junior Class President and Vice President will serve as Co-Chairs for the Prom Committee.
- The Prom will be held in the Multi-Purpose Building.
- All fines and fees must be cleared before a student is allowed to purchase a ticket to the Prom.
- Students are allowed to bring dates that do not attend WAHS so long as the guest student's Principal approves. Students may not bring a date that has been out of high school for more than two years.
