School Safety



A Shared Responsibility

The safety and well-being of our students are our highest priorities here at the School District of Westfield. We are committed to fostering a nurturing and secure school environment, and we do this through daily interactions and educational opportunities that promote student wellness, internet safety, physical safety, and the

development of a positive school community.

One of the fundamental ways we ensure a safe school environment is by teaching our students that safety is a shared responsibility. We encourage them with the phrase, "If you see something, say something." By speaking up, we can all contribute to keeping each other safe.

In addition to promoting a culture of safety through positive daily interactions and lessons, we also regularly practice emergency drills and procedures throughout the school year. These drills are essential in preparing students and staff to respond calmly and effectively in the event of an emergency. They cover a range of scenarios, including evacuation procedures, addressing potential threats of violence, handling medical emergencies, and responding to a school intruder.

During the September and October months, our students and staff participate in drills such as Evacuation and Administrative Hold. We also engage in discussions that help everyone better understand how to respond in the unlikely event of a threat of violence within the school setting.

We kindly request your support in reinforcing these scenarios with your child(ren) in an ageappropriate manner. The skills and knowledge gained from these discussions extend beyond the school day and can be applied in various settings, contributing to the overall safety of our community.

Thank you for your continued partnership in creating a safe and nurturing environment for our students. Together, we can ensure a secure and supportive learning experience for all.



Purpose: Whenever it is determined it is safer outside than inside the building. (Ex. Fire, Bomb Threat, Etc.)



ALICE(Alert, Lockdown
(hide), Inform, Counter (fight), Evacuate (run)
Purpose: Used when there is a threat of
violence or a serious incident that could
jeopardize the safety of students/staff
(Example: Intruder, shooting, hostage
incident, etc.)



Purpose: Used when hallways or common areas need to be free of students for medical or administrative reasons.

(Example; medical emergency so emergency personnel can move through the hallway freely.)




SHELTER IN PLACE

Purpose: Provides a refuge for students, staff and public inside the school building during an emergency such as severe weather, hazardous materials released outdoors, threat to safety of staff/students outside of the building.
