Homecoming Court Eligibility Requirements

1. NO IN-SCHOOL OR OUT-OF-SCHOOL SUSPENSIONS

The student did not receive any in-school suspensions or out-of-school suspensions during their junior or senior year*.

2. NO CO-CURRICULAR CODE VIOLATIONS

The student did not receive any co-curricular violations during their high school career*.

3. NO TRUANCY NOTICES

The student has not received any truancy notices or citations during their junior or senior year*.

4. FALL ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION

The student must participate in a fall athletic program, through the end of the season for all four years of high school.

5. 2.0 GPA OR HIGHER DURING 4th QUARTER OF JUNIOR YEAR

*Junior and Senior year are defined as the fiscal school year (July 1st through – June 30th). The student did not engage in any activity or behavior during high school that would deem him or her ineligible for Homecoming Court, as decided by the Senior Class Advisors, Athletic Director, or Principals.

Homecoming Procedures

1. Homecoming Court will consist of the following:

Male Participants

- o 4 Football
- o 2 Cross Country

Female Participants

- o 3 Volleyball
- o 2 Cross Country
- o 1 Cheerleading
- 2. If an athletic program cannot fulfill the number requirements, administration will adjust to accommodate.
- 3. The fall athletic programs will vote to select their specific representatives.
- 4. The entire student body will vote to select the Homecoming King and Queen.
- 5. Students who were Prom King or Queen are eligible to be on Homecoming Court, but not eligible to become Homecoming King or Queen.
- 6. All fines and fees must be cleared before a student is allowed to attend the Homecoming Dance.
- 7. All fines and fees must be cleared before a student is allowed to be on Homecoming Court.
- 8. Students are allowed to bring dates that do not attend WAHS so long as the guest student's Principal approves. Students may not bring a date that has been out of high school for more than two years.
